

**Foundations of Homeland Security** Students are eligible to begin this pathway in grade 10.

This course introduces students to Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness guidelines, concepts, and action plans. Emphasis is placed on unique aspects of public safety and public health.

<u>Administration of Justice 1</u> Prerequisite: Successful completion of Foundations of Homeland Security is required.

This class introduces students to multiple aspects of criminal justice and law enforcement. Students explore the criminal process, various forces that impact law enforcement, and the rights of citizens.

**Administration of Justice 2** Prerequisite: Successful completion of Administration of Justice 1 is required.

This class will continue the student's knowledge of criminal justice and law enforcement. In this course students will be introduced to evidence collection, analysis, and forensic examination.

<u>Work Experience in Homeland Security</u> Prerequisite: Successful completion of the first two courses in this pathway is required.

The internship should be taken simultaneously with Administration of Justice 2. Students will have the option of completing an industry mentored project or internship.
