COMMUNITY DESCRIPTION

As of the census of 2020, there were 29,409 people, 10,408 households, and 7,884 families residing in the CDP. The racial makeup of the CDP was 68.2% White, 13.3% African American, 0.0% Native American, 12.8% Asian, 0.00% Pacific Islander and 4.0% from two or more races. Hispanic or Latino of any race were 3.9% of the population.

The median income for a household in the CDP was \$91,702 and the median income for a family was \$100,521 (these figures are based on the 2017 American Community Survey in conjunction with the census). 8.1% of the population were below the poverty line,

Perry Hall High School is one of twenty-four public high schools operated by Baltimore County Public Schools. We are a four-year comprehensive school serving approximately 2,000 students. Our school is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and is a member of the College Entrance Examination Board. Perry Hall High offers a broad range of programs including Gifted and Talented, Advanced Placement, Honors, Standard, Special Education as well as the Early College Access Program through the Community College of Baltimore County.
