## COMMUNITY DESCRIPTION

As of the census of 2020, there were 29,409 people, 10,408 households, and 7,884 families residing in the CDP. The racial makeup of the CDP was $68.2 \%$ White, $13.3 \%$ African American, $0.0 \%$ Native American, $12.8 \%$ Asian, $0.00 \%$ Pacific Islander and $4.0 \%$ from two or more races. Hispanic or Latino of any race were $3.9 \%$ of the population.

The median income for a household in the CDP was $\$ 91,702$ and the median income for a family was $\$ 100,521$ (these figures are based on the 2017 American Community Survey in conjunction with the census). $8.1 \%$ of the population were below the poverty line,
