Lead in Drinking Water – Public and Nonpublic Schools IMPORTANT NOTICE: ELEVATED WATER SAMPLE RESULT(S) Perry Hall High School

ELEVATED LEAD WATER SAMPLE RESULT(S)

All Maryland public and nonpublic schools are required to sample all drinking water sources for the presence of lead pursuant to the Code of Maryland Regulations. On May 23, 2023, 1 water sample was collected from Perry Hall High School. Of these water samples, (1) had levels of lead exceeding the action level of 5 parts per billion (ppb) for lead in drinking water in school buildings. The elevated lead results from the sample(s) collected from Perry Hall High School were as follows:

15.0 parts per billion (ppb) Spigot, Laundry Room,

IMMEDIATE ACTIONS TAKEN

Fixtures with elevated levels were marked as handwash only. If flush sample result is below the AL, kitchen fixtures above the AL were labeled with "Flush for 30 Seconds Before Use". Water fountains at or above the action level have been made inaccessible. A work order was submitted to have these fixtures replaced. Bottled water will continue to be provided for drinking.

NEXT STEPS

The fixture will be remediated. It will not be returned to typical operation until it has been sampled and found to be below the action level. Upon completion of this action a notification will be sent to the school community. Bottled drinking water will continue to be provided until all drinking water fixtures are sampled and found to be below the action level.

ACTION LEVEL (AL)

The AL is 5 ppb for lead in drinking water in school buildings. The AL is the concentration of lead which, if exceeded, triggers required remediation.

LOCAL AND FEDERAL DRINKING WATER STANDARDS

Without being required to do so, BCPS has tested school drinking fountains for lead since 2016. There are no federal regulations for schools regarding drinking water. The federal Clean Drinking Water Act requires public water systems to test for lead. Nine of our schools have well systems, and those systems have tested for lead as required.

HEALTH EFFECTS OF LEAD

Lead can cause serious health problems if too much enters your body from drinking water or other sources. It can cause damage to the brain and kidneys and can interfere with the production of red blood cells that carry oxygen to all parts of your body. The greatest risk of lead exposure is to infants, young children, and pregnant women. Lead is stored in the bones, and it can be released later in life. During pregnancy, the fetus receives lead from the mother's bones, which may affect brain development. Scientists have linked the effects of lead on the brain with lowered IQ in children. Adults with kidney problems and high blood pressure can be affected by low levels of lead more than healthy adults.

SOURCES OF HUMAN EXPOSURE TO LEAD

There are many different sources of human exposure to lead. These include lead-based paint, lead-contaminated dust or soil, some plumbing materials, certain types of pottery, pewter, brass fixtures, food, and cosmetics, exposure in the workplace and exposure from certain hobbies, brass faucets, fittings, and valves. According to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), 10 to 20 percent of a person's potential exposure to lead may come from drinking water, while for an infant consuming formula mixed with lead-containing water this may increase to 40 to 60 percent.

HOW CONSUMERS CAN REDUCE EXPOSURE TO LEAD IN DRINKING WATER

- Run your water to flush out lead: If water hasn't been used for several hours, run water for 15
 to 30 seconds or until it becomes cold or reaches a steady temperature before using it for
 drinking or cooking.
- Use cold water for cooking and preparing baby formula. If lead was present in the plumbing, it would dissolve more easily in hot water.


Please note that boiling the water will not reduce lead levels.

Maryland Girls State Summer Program for Juniors

Are you a female Junior interested in government, law or politics? ALA Maryland Girls State is a summer weeklong learning experience, often held at Salisbury University where rising seniors live in "cities" within a dormitory-like setting. Our program uses a nonpartisan curriculum where students assume the roles of government leaders, campaigning in mock parties (often called "Federalists" and "Nationalists") to become mayors and county and state officials of their ALA Girls State. They offer both college and career readiness in our program. The program costs \$290 which includes housing, meals, a shirt, and a phone wallet **which is paid for** by an American Legion Auxiliary Unit. There is a \$45 registration fee that the attendee is responsible to pay, but this fee potentially can be covered by request to the sponsoring American Legion Auxiliary Unit. We encourage all interested young ladies in their junior year of high school to apply and we will work with them to find a sponsoring unit. Participants who are direct descendants of US Wartime Veterans or Active-Duty Service members are eligible to apply for the Samsung Scholarship which covers up to \$10,000 of the winner's college tuition. There are a few other scholarships offered as well.
